Pennsylvania is not paying its fair share for public schools. It ranks 46th in the country in state share of education costs. Pennsylvania also has the widest gap in the U.S. between the highest and lowest spending school districts.

What does this mean for the Central Greene School District?

52% Share of education costs covered by local taxpayers in the Central Greene School District. Property tax burden rank 203.

16%

School property tax increases since 2011 in the Central Greene School District.

\$785,231 The increase to Central Greene School District if it were fully funded by the state.
