

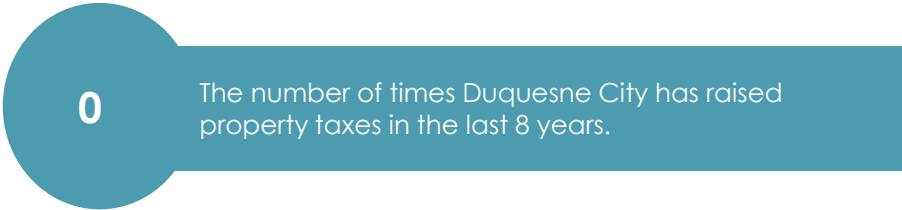


Duquesne City

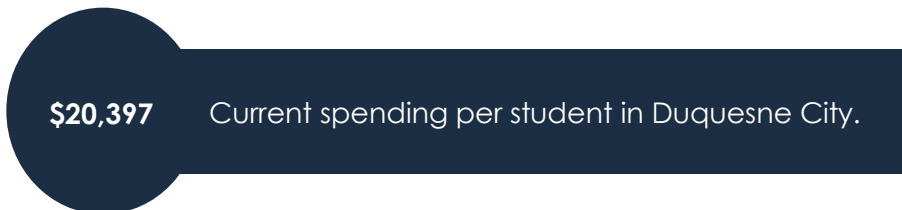
