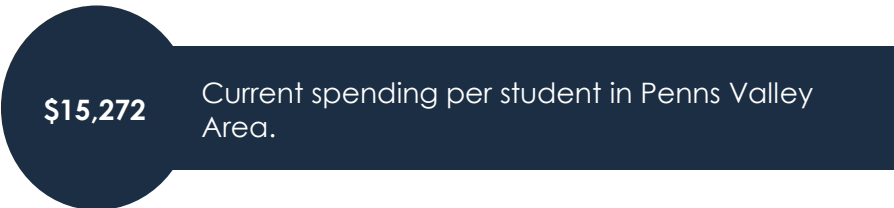
Penns Valley Area School District Factsheet
