



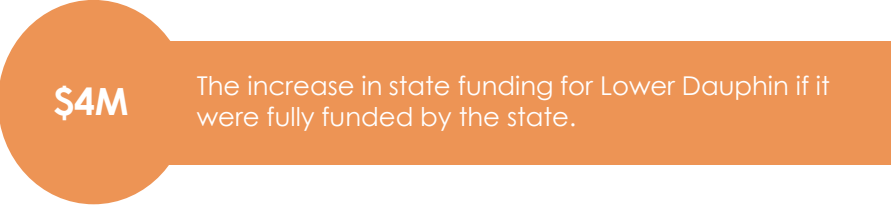

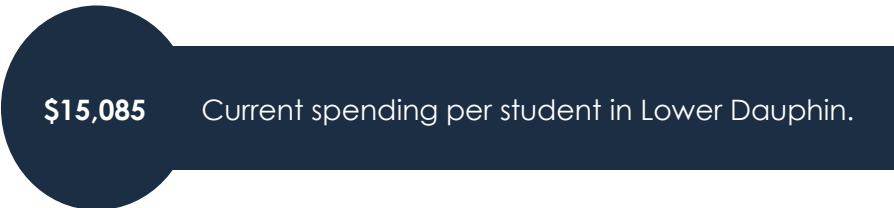
School District Factsheet
