

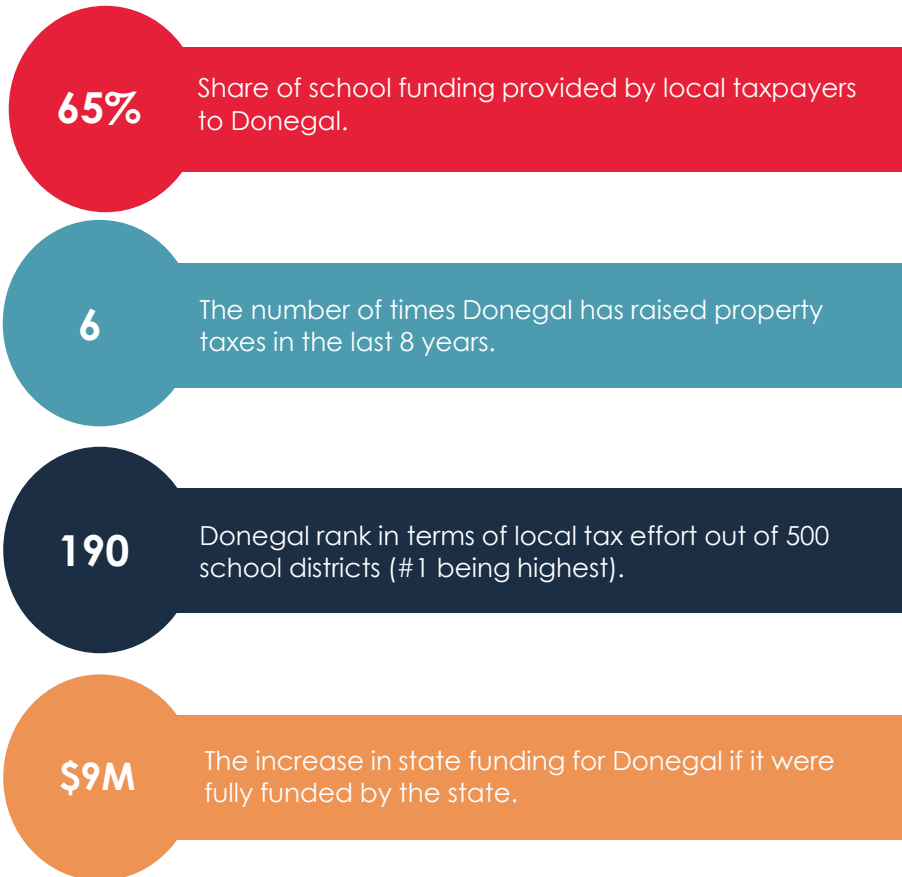


Donegal

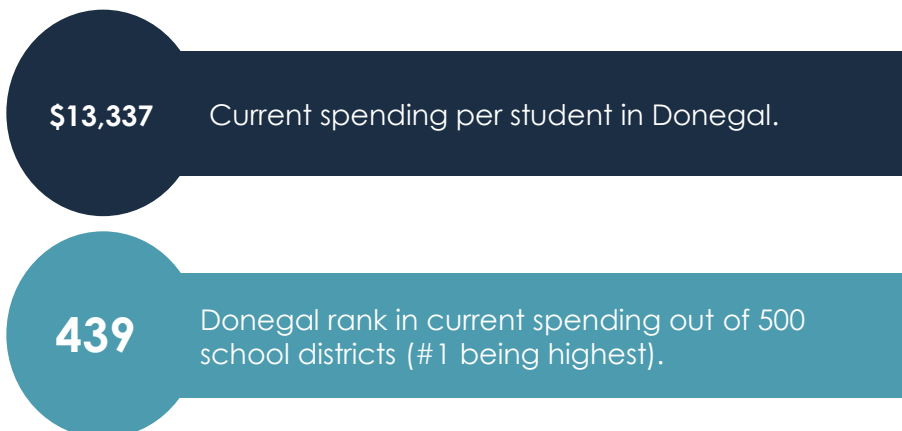
