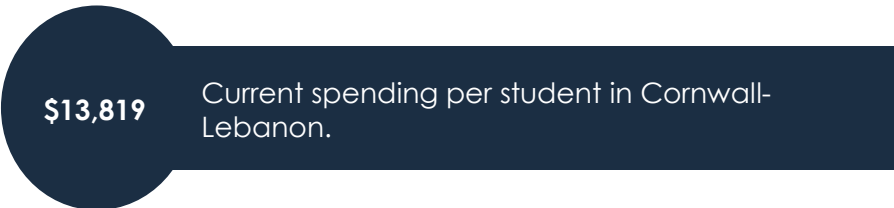
School District Factsheet
