Pennsylvania is not paying its fair share for public schools. It ranks 45th in the country in state share of education costs.

What does this mean for the Avella Area School District?

Share of school funding provided by local taxpayers 22% to Avella Area. Number of times Avella Area has raised property 8 taxes in the last 12 years.
